Outpatient Cancer Center:

Lab technicians are helping patients with leukemia and other blood disorders receive better treatment and diagnoses with advanced microscope technology to process and evaluate white blood cell differentials with higher resolution and better definition.

Acute Rehab:

The acute rehab program in Berkeley utilizes a new state-of-the-art swallow study technology allowing speech-language pathologists to assess patient swallowing function to meet the needs of the community. In Oakland, 3 new technologies are assisting acute rehabilitation patients. Therapists can now perform hearing assessments and refer patients to an audiologist if necessary. And patients with spinal cord injuries who have some use of upper extremities and hands can now be supported with two different kinds of arm support devices to assist patients in daily living activities like self-feeding or tooth brushing, while adding strength to the arms.

COMMUNITY

Emergency Department:

New comprehensive GlideScope intubation system, for laryngoscopy, bronchoscopy and other airway procedures has become one of the most valuable tools in the ED. High quality visualization eases difficult intubations when time is of the essence. Wearable cardiac monitors for ED patients allows for remote patient monitoring in the waiting room if beds are full to provide exceptional care.

Urology Department:

State-of-the-art ablation system for the urology team provides less

invasive surgery options with faster patient recovery times.

Hologic Video System:

In-office Hologic hysteroscopy and polypectomy video system provides safe, accessible and affordable care to patients without needing to go to a hospital OR. More than 260 procedures were completed in 2022 providing more flexibility for patients and clinicians and keeping patients out of the hospital.

Retinopathy Screening:

Early-stage diabetic retinopathy does not have symptoms, making early detection important to prevent blindness. Screening in an outpatient setting allows patients to have critical examinations to help diabetic patients retain their vision and provide referrals to ophthalmologists if necessary.

Pregnancy Care Companion App:

Personalized pregnancy care to track key milestones and automatically receive timely health reminders and educational materials. 2 out of 3 expectant mothers across the system enrolled, lowering the volume of messages to care teams by 16%. Donor gifts expand the app with resources for vulnerable populations as part of our mission to leverage technology to reduce health disparities and ensure more equitable outcomes, screening for perinatal mental health signs to follow at-risk groups.

Mobile Mammography Van:

Has provided nearly 350 screenings at 51 events since launching in late 2020. The vehicle has traveled 460 miles to 12 community health centers


